MULTIPLE FACULTY POSITIONS
UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA

The University of Florida (UF) is embarking upon a University-wide recruiting initiative in One Health. We are seeking candidates for at least two tenure-track positions at the rank of Associate or Full Professor. Applicants must hold a PhD, DVM, MD, or other terminal degree and have significant postdoctoral research experience. The successful candidates will be expected to establish a strong, independent, externally-funded research program in their area of expertise and join trans-disciplinary groups of UF scientists in the health, social, and life sciences. These groups are engaged in One Health research programs and initiatives in Florida, the United States, and multiple international settings. The successful candidates will be expected to attract extra-mural funding and to lead and collaborate in One Health programs and initiatives that reach across the boundaries of UF academic units. These units include the Health Science Center (comprised of the Colleges of Dentistry, Nursing, Medicine, Pharmacy, Public Health and Health Professions, and Veterinary Medicine), the Emerging Pathogens Institute, the Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, the Cancer and Genetics Institute, the Clinical and Translational Science Institute, the Florida Climate Institute, the Center for African Studies, the Center for Latin American Studies, the College of Engineering (among others), and other institutions--nationally and internationally. This recruitment is part of a growing commitment by the University of Florida to investigate and provide solutions to health challenges that involve humans, animals, and their environments in dynamic local, national, and international settings. The successful candidates will have the opportunity to participate in teaching and mentoring activities in the PhD, DVM, MPH, MS, DVM-MPH, and certificate graduate education programs, several of which have a specific focus in One Health. Accomplished researchers with backgrounds in large animal field research, zoonotic diseases, foreign animal diseases, emerging pathogens, neglected diseases, epidemiology, disease modeling, environmental toxicology, parasitology, international disease surveillance, or population ecology are strongly encouraged to apply. Applicants with significant transferable Federal funding will be given preference, and a track record of applied research will strengthen a candidate's application. These full-time (12 month, 1.0 FTE, 100% state-funded) positions offer outstanding scholarly and scientific opportunities in a collegial environment with well-established programs that are supported by state-of-the-art core facilities. Gainesville has excellent recreational opportunities, a reasonable cost of living, and a pleasant climate. Salary is commensurate with experience. The successful candidate will be an affiliate of the new University of Florida One Health Center of Excellence, with affiliate faculty status in the Emerging Pathogens Institute and a tenure home in an appropriate department at the University of Florida.

The University of Florida is an equal opportunity institution dedicated to building a broadly diverse and inclusive faculty and staff.

Applicants should submit a curriculum vitae, a letter of intent including the applicant's vision, philosophy, accomplishments, and future goals in research and education with a concentration in One Health, as well as the names and contact information for three references. Letters should address the applicant's vision and goals for their role in the One Health initiative. Final candidate will be required to provide official transcript to the hiring department upon hire. A transcript will not be considered "official" if a designation of "Issued to Student" is visible. Degrees earned from an education institution outside of the United States are required to be

evaluated by a professional credentialing service provider approved by National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES), which can be found at <http://www.naces.org/>.
